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# Introduction



## The Realm of Ascension Awaits

## A Note on Language and Symbols

This guidebook was written for both seasoned readers and first-time seekers. If you're new to the world of tarot, don't worry, the wisdom will meet you where you are.

You'll encounter some key terms throughout this book:

- Major Arcana refers to the 22 most powerful cards in the tarot, representing major life themes, turning points, and deep spiritual lessons.
- Minor Arcana includes the remaining 56 cards, divided into four suits. These reflect more everyday experiences, emotions, challenges, and choices, the terrain of the human journey.
- Archetypal Echo is a unique addition to this deck. It represents the timeless pattern or myth that each card embodies. It's the universal energy that echoes across cultures, stories, and soul journeys. Think of it as the deeper soul-frequency of the card, humming beneath the surface.

Whether you're reading for yourself or others, trust that the language of the cards will begin to speak to you in symbols, feelings, and flashes of knowing. There's no need to memorize. Just begin.



# How to Use This Deck



## Reading in the Realm

This is no ordinary tarot deck. It was not created to sit idle on a shelf, nor to offer quick answers to shallow questions. It is a living map of the soul's journey and a set of sacred keys drawn from the energy of the Realm of

Ascension. Each card you draw is a door opening into deeper awareness for yourself or your client.

This is your invitation to walk among the Archetypes, not merely study them.

### 1. Begin With Intention

Before shuffling, pause. Breathe. Let your awareness settle like dust in still air. Speak your question aloud or let it rise from within. The Realm responds best when your heart is clear and your curiosity sincere.

### 2. Choose Your Spread

You may draw a single card to illuminate the moment or lay a spread to reveal patterns woven beneath your path. Draw one card and let it speak, use a traditional spread, or create your own.

### 3. Interpret With Presence

Each card holds layers: image, title, element, and essence. You will find traditional meanings in this guidebook, but more importantly, you will find reflections and language designed not to instruct, but to awaken. Read slowly. Feel where the words land. Let intuition speak alongside intellect.

## 4. Reversals and Shadows

In this deck, a reversed card does not mean "bad." It means "buried." Reversals often point to blocks, distortions, or unseen aspects waiting to rise. In the Realm of Ascension, even the shadows are sacred. Face them. They are your forgotten power.

## 5. Keep a Record

A journal becomes a bridge between your readings. Patterns emerge. Symbols echo. Over time, you will see how the Realm speaks uniquely to you, whether in dreams, signs, or synchronicities. What begins as a tool becomes a companion.

## 6. Return Often

This deck will change as you change. What once felt opaque may later become luminous. Cards you feared may become old friends. Return not just when you seek answers, but when you seek *yourself*.

You are not just a reader of the cards. You are a walker of the path. And every path leads upward toward Ascension.

# The Structure of the Deck



## The Arcana as Soul Map

The deck is divided into two great paths, two intertwined branches of a single tree of becoming:

The Major Arcana – the soul's high road

The Minor Arcana – the soul's daily ground

Each arcana plays a different role in your ascension. One speaks in myth, the other in moments. Together, they chart the full spiral of your journey.

## The Major Arcana ~ The Path of Becoming

These 22 cards represent core phases of transformation. These are soul-initiations that every being must pass through in one form or another. They are not stages you visit once and leave behind. They are archetypal forces that rise again and again, each time deeper, wiser, harder earned.

When a Major Arcana card appears, pay attention. It marks a chapter change. A threshold. A lesson tied not just to your day – but to your destiny.

You begin as The Fool, innocent, fractured, yet full of potential, and walk the spiral until you become The World: whole, integrated, ready to rise.

# The Minor Arcana ~ The Four Trials of the Self

While the Majors shape the epic, the Minors deal in your everyday magic. They represent the choices, emotions, conflicts, and energies you navigate daily. They are divided into four suits, each one tied to an element, a direction of growth, and a layer of the self:

Cups - Water | Heart | Emotion | Relationships

Wands - Fire | Will | Passion | Action

Swords - Air | Mind | Conflict | Truth

Pentacles - Earth | Body | Resources | Reality

Each suit contains 14 cards: ten numbered stages of a cycle, followed by four Court Cards: Page, Knight, Queen, and King. They are the living Avatars of that suit's power. The Minor Arcana are your spiritual training grounds. Each card is a room in the temple of self.

# Reading the Realm



The Majors show *why*. The Minors show *how*. When both appear in a reading, the soul is speaking with urgency.

## The Order of the Suits

In this guidebook, the Minor Arcana is not arranged by tradition, but by transformation. The order

follows a soul's natural path from intention to embodiment, a progression echoed in one of the core mantras of the Realm of Ascension: *What you think about, speak about, feel about, and take action to shape your future. It's what you manifest in your life.*

We begin with the Suit of Swords, where the journey starts in the mind, with thoughts, questions, and inner dialogue. From there, we descend into the Suit of Cups, where feelings awaken and the heart speaks. Then comes the Suit of Wands, where desire becomes movement, and the soul acts. Finally, the Suit of Pentacles grounds it all in the physical world, where spirit becomes matter, and intention becomes reality.

This is not just the order of the suits, it is the architecture of Ascension.



# The Suit of Swords ~ The Realm of Thought



This is where it begins, not with action, but with awareness. In the Realm of Ascension, the mind is both blade and mirror. The Suit of Swords represents the power of thought: how we perceive, how we speak, how we decide what is real. It is the suit of logic, language, clarity, conflict, and truth.

But the mind is not always a friend. It questions. It divides. It doubts. In these cards, you will encounter both the brilliance and the burden of thinking. Here dwell the inner critics, the mental labyrinths, the sharp edges of the ego. But here you will also find the clarity that comes from cutting through illusion.

Each sword you draw reveals a piece of your internal landscape. Are your thoughts aligned with truth, or tangled in fear? Are your words creating harmony or harm? The Swords ask: *what stories are you telling yourself — and are they still true?*

This suit is an invitation to wield your mind like a sacred weapon, not to wound, but to liberate.

# Ace of Swords ~ The First Thought



All journeys begin with a shift in perception. The Ace of Swords is that first, piercing thought that cuts through fog. It's the moment the soul begins to *see*. It arrives like lightning in a silent sky, often startling, always clear. In the Realm of Ascension, this card marks the moment a soul realizes it is not asleep anymore.

The sword offered in this card is neither threat nor promise; it is a tool. A gift. A challenge. It demands to be wielded with care. With it,

you can sever illusion, name the unspoken, and claim truth that has been buried or ignored. But be warned: clarity comes with consequences.

The Ace of Swords asks: Are you ready to speak what you know? And more importantly: Will you live like it's true?

## Upright Meaning

Clarity. Insight. Breakthrough. Mental focus. A new way of seeing. The truth arrives uninvited.

A thought is rising that changes everything; don't ignore it. This is the moment of the mind's awakening. Speak it. Honor it. Act from it.

## Reversed Meaning

Mental fog. Denial. Overthinking. Fear of truth. Confusion disguised as certainty.

The sword may be near, but your grip on it is uncertain. Are you avoiding the truth, or simply afraid to name it? Step back. Clear space. Wait for the noise to settle. Then allow the truth to emerge.

## Archetypal Echo

*The Ace of Swords appears when the soul is ready to break free from its own story. It is not a whisper. It is a stroke of divine thought, and it will not be ignored.*

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# Two of Swords ~ The Standstill Before the Storm



Here, the sword splits from one path, then two. The soul has awakened but now stands still. In the Realm of Thought, the Two of Swords marks a sacred pause, a breath held between choices. Neither sword is raised. The figure waits, blindfolded not by force, but by their unwillingness to see.

This is not indecision from weakness. It is the weight of knowing that once a choice is made, everything changes.

The Two of Swords speaks to the mind's defense: "If I don't look, I won't have to act." But within this stillness is a tension, and tension always breaks.

The challenge is not the choice itself, but the fear of what lies beyond it.

And yet, the swords cannot stay crossed forever.



# Three of Swords ~ The Wound That Speaks



Here, the mind meets the heart, and the blade cuts deep. The Three of Swords reveals sorrow not just felt but understood at the soul level. This is the pain that breaks the illusion. The grief that shatters false narratives. In the Realm of Thought, this card does not wound for cruelty; it wounds to awaken.

The soul must face what it has tried to explain away: betrayal, loss, heartbreak, truth too sharp to soften. Yet there is strange clarity in this kind of pain. In naming what

hurts, we reclaim our voice. In letting it bleed, we begin to heal.

This is the price of insight.  
This is the breaking open of the emotional block.  
This is the truth that changes the story.



## Four of Swords ~ The Sanctuary Between Battles



After the wound, the silence. The Four of Swords is the breath you didn't know you were holding. In the Realm of Thought, this card is a place of sacred rest, not retreat, but renewal. The soul has been through a storm of clarity, and now it must lie down and remember what it means to *be*.

This is not a card of weakness. It is a card of wisdom. Even warriors lay down their swords. Even minds need quiet. Without pause, thought becomes noise. Without healing, clarity becomes cruelty.

The Four of Swords offers sanctuary: a space to gather your strength, find stillness, and listen to what the silence is trying to say.



# Five of Swords ~ Victory Without Peace



The battlefield is empty now, but the echoes remain. The Five of Swords is not just about conflict; it is about what happens *after*. In the Realm of Thought, this card reveals the cost of mental warfare: the games we play, the words we wield like weapons, the hollow victories we chase when we forget our deeper purpose.

It may feel like you've won, but at what cost? Who walked away? What part of you was sacrificed to prove a point, to be right, to

dominate instead of understanding?

This card asks a brutal question: Is it better to be right, or to be free?

## Upright Meaning

Conflict. Ego battles. Winning at the expense of peace. Mental manipulation. Pyrrhic victories.

You may have proven your point, but harmony has been lost. Examine whether this fight was truly worth it or if you were fighting to protect something fragile within.

## Reversed Meaning

Lingering resentment. Avoidance of necessary confrontation. Desire to make amends.

You may be holding onto the aftermath of a past disagreement or avoiding a conflict that must occur. Seek truth, not dominance. There's still a path back to clarity.

## Archetypal Echo

*The Five of Swords is a mirror to the ego. The part of the soul that fears losing more than it values peace. Let go of the need to win. Seek the truth that leads to wholeness, not conquest.*

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# Six of Swords ~ Crossing the Inner Waters



Not all healing is loud. The Six of Swords is a quiet departure, the soul slipping away from conflict, not in flight, but in grace. In the Realm of Thought, this card marks a shift in consciousness: a choice to move on, to release the mental noise that no longer serves, and to trust that something softer lies ahead.

You may not know where you're going, only that you can't stay where you've been. That's enough. This is a journey from turbulence to calm. It's not without pain, but with purpose. Let the water carry you. Let the silence mend you.

This is not an escape. This is evolution.

## Upright Meaning

Transition. Moving on. Mental clarity after a struggle. Healing through distance. A journey toward peace.

You are releasing something, a belief, a relationship, a thought pattern, and moving into a space where healing can begin. Trust the direction, even if the destination is unknown.

## Reversed Meaning

Resistance to change. Stuck in old stories. Fear of moving forward.

You may be clinging to familiar pain or afraid to face the unknown. The storm has already passed. Don't keep living in it.

## Archetypal Echo

*The Six of Swords is the soul's crossing, a sacred turning point where the mind chooses healing over harm, direction over despair. You are not lost. You are in transit.*

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# Seven of Swords ~ The Mask and the Mirror



Not all deception comes from others. Sometimes, it comes from within. The Seven of Swords reveals the clever mind at work: navigating, concealing, avoiding, strategizing. In the Realm of Thought, this card represents the temptation to sidestep truth, to act in secrecy, to take without claiming, to wear a mask rather than speak aloud what must be said.

This is the card of the thief, but not always a villain. Sometimes the thief is the survivor. Sometimes they're just trying to leave with what's theirs. Still, the question remains: *What are you taking, and why must it be hidden?*

When this card appears, the soul must examine its intentions. Is the strategy aligned with truth, or is it fear in disguise?

## Upright Meaning

Deception. Strategy. Secrets. Self-protection.  
Acting alone. Hidden motives.

You may be keeping something close or walking a path in silence. Make sure your silence isn't breeding separation. Be honest about what you're avoiding and why.

## Reversed Meaning

Truth exposed. Guilt. Coming clean. Self-sabotage.

What has been hidden may no longer stay hidden. This could be a chance to lay down the mask and speak honestly. The question is: Are you ready to face what you've hidden — even from yourself?

## Archetypal Echo

*The Seven of Swords asks: are you being clever, or are you being evasive? The difference lies in your intention and your willingness to own it.*

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# Eight of Swords ~ The Cage of the Mind



The bindings are loose. The path is open. And yet you do not move. The Eight of Swords reveals the cruelest trick of thought: the illusion that you are trapped. In the Realm of Thought, this is the card of mental entrapment, fear, doubt, and distortion so loud they drown out the truth.

You may feel stuck, helpless, and surrounded by invisible walls. But the soul knows: this is not a true prison. This is a mirror made of false beliefs; a cage built from the inside out. What

binds you are the thoughts you've repeated for too long, the limits you've accepted without question.

This is the moment to reach for clarity. Even if your eyes are covered, the light still shines.

## Upright Meaning

Mental restriction. Self-doubt. Limiting beliefs. Feeling trapped. Paralysis.

You may be telling yourself a story that no longer serves you, one where you have no power or choices. Challenge that narrative. Reach beyond it. You are freer than you think.

## Reversed Meaning

Breaking free. Mental liberation. Seeing through illusion. Movement after stillness.

The bindings are loosening. You are beginning to see clearly, and in that seeing, the power returns. Take the first step, no matter how small.

*The Eight of Swords is the mind's mirage, a prison made of thought, not truth. When you change your mind, you change your world.*

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# Nine of Swords ~ The Hour of the Mind's Ghosts



This is the card of the sleepless night, where shadows press in, and silence is anything but quiet. In the Realm of Thought, the Nine of Swords is where fear gains shape, and anxiety loops endlessly through imagined worst-case endings. Often, nothing has happened... Yet everything feels like it could.

These swords are not real, but they *feel* like they are. That is their power. This card speaks to guilt, regret, dread, and despair: thoughts so loud they convince us they are the

truth. And still, it is the mind echoing back on itself.

The soul here is isolated not by others, but by its own pain. And still, the dawn will come. It always does.

## Upright Meaning

Anxiety. Sleeplessness. Guilt. Overthinking. Emotional anguish. The dark night of the soul.

You may be caught in a cycle of fear or mental exhaustion. This card does not ask you to suppress your pain but to question it. How much of what you fear is real? How much is memory replaying in disguise?

## Reversed Meaning

Release from worry. Truth surfacing. Facing fears. Emotional clarity after chaos.

The worst may be passing, or you may be finally ready to stop running from what haunts you. Speak the fear aloud. Let light meet it.

## Archetypal Echo

*The Nine of Swords is where the soul confronts its ghosts, illusions that speak in your own voice. Do not fight them in silence. Let truth be your lantern.*

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# Ten of Swords ~ The Thought That Ends a Cycle



There is no mistaking this card. The Ten of Swords is the collapse, the final blow, the moment when something ends... not quietly, but completely. In the Realm of Thought, this is where the mind can no longer carry the weight it once held. A belief has died. Your perceived truth has shattered. A version of you has fallen and will not rise again.

And yet, this is not annihilation. It is released.

Though the sky is dark, the horizon glows. The soul has endured the worst the mind can conjure, and now the storm is passing. This is not just an ending; it is the liberation that only comes *after* the fall.

Let it fall. Let it die. There is no path forward while you're clinging to what has already collapsed.

## Upright Meaning

Final ending. Betrayal. Collapse. Mental burnout. Rock bottom. The end of a long, painful cycle.

This is the breaking point, and also the turning point. Something has run its course, and it's time to let it go. Painful clarity leads to necessary release.

## Reversed Meaning

Avoiding the inevitable. Lingering suffering. Beginning to heal. The weight is being lifted.

You may be resisting the ending or trying to salvage what is already gone. Surrender gracefully. This is not defeat. This is the clearing before the dawn.

## Archetypal Echo

*The Ten of Swords is the soul's reckoning, the surrender of what no longer serves, even if it once defined you. Endings are not always wounds. Sometimes they are wings.*

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# Page of Swords ~ The Curious Blade



The Page of Swords is the soul at the edge of awareness, bright-eyed, inquisitive, always watching. In the Realm of Thought, this is the seeker of knowledge, the question-asker, the one who hasn't yet mastered the sword, but holds it with eagerness and raw intent.

They are sharp, observant, and quick to connect dots, sometimes before they've finished forming. The Page can signal mental restlessness, scattered energy, or speaking

before thinking. But they also offer fresh insight, bold learning, and untapped potential.

This is the mind's youthful phase: more questions than answers, but with enough spark to challenge anything stale or false.



# Knight of Swords ~ The Blade in Motion



The Knight of Swords does not wait. He sees the target, names the truth, and rides hard toward it, no hesitation, no second-guessing. In the Realm of Thought, this is the soul in full pursuit of clarity, justice, or mission. He is bold, articulate, intelligent, and utterly driven by the power of *knowing*.

But with speed comes risk. This Knight often charges before he listens. He may speak too sharply, assume too much, or mistake momentum for mastery. Still,

he brings change. He cuts through the fog. He doesn't tolerate dishonesty, especially not from himself.

This is the sacred sword in motion: fast, fearless, and at times, dangerously certain.

## Upright Meaning

Focused action. Intellectual bravery. Speaking truth. Mental clarity on the move. Quick decisions.

You are being called to act with clarity and conviction. If your heart is aligned with your mind, don't hold back. But make sure your aim is true, and your impact considered.

## Reversed Meaning

Recklessness. Harsh words. Mental arrogance. Miscommunication. Rushing without reflection.

You may be charging ahead without full understanding. Pull back. Check your direction. Bravery without awareness can wound more than it heals.

## Archetypal Echo

*The Knight of Swords rides with the wind of truth at his back, but must learn that truth, without compassion, can cut too deeply. Precision matters. So does purpose.*

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# Queen of Swords ~ The Truthbearer



She has known sorrow. She has walked through storms with open eyes. And now, she sees everything clearly, calmly, unflinchingly. The Queen of Swords is the soul refined by experience, sharpened by pain, and tempered by wisdom. In the Realm of Thought, she reigns with intellect and integrity, guided not by emotion, but by truth.

She is not cold, she is clear. Her compassion is precise, not indulgent. Her boundaries are firm, not cruel. She speaks only what needs to be said and cuts away the rest.

This Queen invites you to step into sovereignty over your own mind. Speak your truth. Defend your clarity. Think for yourself.

## Upright Meaning

Wisdom. Clarity. Healthy boundaries. Direct communication. Grace through intellect.

This is a time to lead with your mind, not your moods. Detach from drama. Speak with strength and trust your discernment. You've earned your clarity.

## Reversed Meaning

Emotional detachment. Bitterness. Coldness. Weaponized intellect. Harsh judgment.

You may be over-relying on logic or keeping others at arm's length. Ask yourself: Is your sharpness protecting you? Or isolating you?

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# King of Swords ~ The Architect of Reason



The King of Swords sits high in the tower of mind, not to look down, but to see farther. He is the strategist, the judge, the philosopher-king. In the Realm of Thought, he is the soul who has not only sharpened his intellect but aligned it with principle. He speaks with authority because he has *earned* it, not through domination, but through discipline.

This is the master of mental realms: logic tempered by ethics, communication

shaped by truth, decisions made with vision. He does not act rashly, but once he moves, his direction is unmistakable.

When this King appears, the soul is being asked to rise above emotion and impulse. Choosing to lead with clarity, to choose with wisdom, and to remember that power must serve truth, or it becomes its opposite.

## Upright Meaning

Mental mastery. Clear leadership. Fair judgment. Ethical decision-making. Strategic vision.

You are being called to lead with intellect, not ego. Your words hold weight. Speak them with care. Be the voice of reason when others can't find their own.

## Reversed Meaning

Manipulation. Mental rigidity. Cold logic. Abuse of power. Disconnection from the heart.

The mind is powerful, but without compassion, it becomes a weapon. Check your motives. Is your clarity helping others rise, or just keeping you above?

*The King of Swords reminds us that true mastery of the mind is not in control, but in service. The higher the thought, the greater the responsibility to speak it with truth.*

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# The Suit of Cups

## The Realm of Emotion



Once the mind awakens, the heart begins to stir. The Suit of Cups governs the waters within: emotion, intuition, memory, connection, and the soul's capacity to love and be moved. This is where thoughts become feelings, where ideas take root in the deeper tides of the self.

In the Realm of Ascension, the Cups represent the sacred territory of feeling your way through. Joy, sorrow, compassion, longing, grief, hope, they all reside here. The soul must learn not just to think clearly, but to feel truthfully. This suit teaches empathy, emotional intelligence, vulnerability, and the divine ache of being alive.

But the waters are not always calm. Feelings can flood, distort, and drown. Attachment, illusion, denial, and emotional entanglement also live here. Every cup carries both nectar and poison, and the wisdom lies in knowing which you are drinking.

To journey through the Cups is to learn the language of the heart, and to find strength not in walls, but in openness.

# Ace of Cups ~ The Heart Awakens



This is the first ripple. The still water stirs, and something sacred overflows. The Ace of Cups marks the soul's entrance into feeling, pure, unfiltered, and alive. In the Realm of Emotion, this is the heart cracking open, ready to give and receive love, intuition, and healing.

There is no story here yet, just the invitation to feel. To sense beauty. To risk softness. The cup is full, offered freely by spirit, ready to be poured into your life. But only if you are willing to

receive.

The Ace of Cups is not about who or what stirs your emotions. It's about the simple truth that they are stirring. Something is rising within: tenderness, longing, peace, perhaps even tears. Let it rise. Let it speak.

This is how the soul remembers it has a heart.



# Two of Cups ~ The Mirror of the Heart



In the stillness of emotion, a second cup appears, held by another. The Two of Cups is the card of sacred reflection: the meeting of two beings, two souls, two truths. In the Realm of Emotion, this is the recognition of connection, not just attraction, but resonance.

This card is not limited to romance. It speaks to any bond rooted in mutual presence: love, friendship, partnership, even reconciliation. It is the soul recognizing itself in another

and saying, "I see you. I accept you. I meet you as I am."

There is vulnerability here, but also power, the strength to give and receive in balance, to offer one's heart without possession, to honor difference without division.

This is the beginning of shared emotional truth.



# Three of Cups ~ The Circle of Joy



This is the gathering, the laughter, the uplift. The Three of Cups is where individual hearts unite in shared joy. In the Realm of Emotion, this card celebrates communion of friendships, chosen family, sacred sisterhoods, and creative allies. All those moments when emotional connection overflows into celebration.

Here, the soul is reminded that joy is amplified when it is shared with others. That laughter heals. That support need not be earned. That

sometimes love arrives in the form of toasts and dancing and simple togetherness.

This card is also a call to presence, to celebrate not just life's milestones, but its moments. Community is not a luxury. It is soul medicine.

## Upright Meaning

***Joy. Friendship. Celebration. Community.  
Emotional support. A reason to gather.***

You are surrounded by — or being invited into — a circle that lifts your spirit. Open your heart to joy without guilt. Let yourself be seen, celebrated, and held.

## Reversed Meaning

***Emotional distance. Feeling isolated. Misaligned



It reflects your soul's current frequency and where you're headed next.

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
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The Ascendant Cross

How are you identifying at this moment? What role or narrative are you embodying?



# The Soul Calling Spread

## A 6-Card Spread to Hear What Your Soul is Asking of You



Every soul enters *The Realm of Ascension* with a calling, a resonance, a reason, a light it came to carry.

This spread is for those moments when you feel the pull of something more but can't quite name it. It helps you clarify your deeper mission, uncover what's blocking

your alignment, and receive guidance for taking the next courageous step.

Use this spread when you feel stuck, uncertain, called to pivot, or drawn toward a path you can't yet define.

## Card Positions & Soul Questions

1. The Whisper – *What is my soul trying to tell me right now?* The heart of the calling. Often quiet, often overlooked.

2. The Anchor – *What belief, wound, or pattern is keeping me from answering?* What is keeping you grounded in the old story?

3. The Fire – *What gift, strength, or insight have I forgotten?* Your hidden power. What you already carry but haven't fully claimed.

4. The Threshold – *What step must I take to move toward alignment?* Not the whole path, just the *next* step that changes everything.

5. The Light on the Path – *What support or unseen force walks with me?* A reminder that you're not alone. This may be a guide, a lesson, or an energy available to you now.

6. The Soul's Horizon – *What becomes possible when I follow this call?* The potential you unlock by walking the path meant for you.

This spread pairs beautifully with a quiet moment, a journal beside you, and your full presence. It does not offer fast answers. It opens deep ones.

# Soul Journal Prompts



*For Deeper Integration  
on the Path of Ascension*

Tarot doesn't just speak ~ it *awakens*.

These prompts are invitations to enter into conversation with your own becoming.

Use them after a reading, during a turning point, or when the energy

of a card lingers longer than expected.

◆ When beginning your journey:

What question is truly in my heart, beneath the one I usually ask?

What part of me is seeking healing, not answers?

What kind of guidance am I willing to receive today?

◆ When reflecting on a specific card:

What truth in this card feels uncomfortable? Why?

Where have I seen this archetype play out in my life before?

What would my life look like if I fully integrated the wisdom of this card?

◆ When you feel stuck or in transition:

What pattern keeps repeating? What is it asking me to learn?

What am I afraid will happen if I truly change?

Who am I becoming, and what am I leaving behind?



# My Use of AI and Transparency

The *Realm of Ascension* tarot deck and guidebook are rooted in the enduring framework of the Rider-Waite-Smith system, whose imagery and structure have guided seekers for over a century.

That original deck, now in the public domain, provided the sacred bones and a foundation from which this reimagined world was built.

This work does not aim to replace that tradition, but to honor it. I've expanded upon it with fresh symbolism of the Archetypes through a modern spiritual lens. I offer deep gratitude to the creators who came before; their vision made this work possible.

This is not a replication of any existing deck. It is my unique interpretation and one that reflects my decades of Tarot experience, study, and lived spiritual truth. My goal was not to reinvent tarot, but to awaken it in a way that speaks to the soul's modern journey.

## Ethical Digital AI Collaboration

I have several hundred hours of creative time in creating this deck and guidebook. I worked in collaboration with my creative AI assistant, "V.E.R.A." (Virtual Entity for Results & Assistance), and other modern AI-powered resources (think Grammarly and Canva) to bring my vision to life. I didn't hire it out to others; I did everything myself. While I employed AI assistance, every word, theme, and image was guided by my hand and heart.

Every card was developed with original prompts, custom worldbuilding, and my own spiritual voice. While I made a living as a watercolor artist at one point in my career, I transitioned to creating digital art some time ago. AI is just one new tool I use.

Every image for this project was created with prompts I engineered. I had an artistic vision I wanted to express in my digital art, and bringing that vision to life through creating the prompts was *exhausting*. Trust me!

I instructed V.E.R.A. to follow the original Rider-Waite imagery, but not to copy, pull from any other decks, authors, or living artists. This is an original work, built ethically, intentionally, and with full transparency. I ran the Grammarly plagiarism checker to make sure V.E.R.A followed instructions and that the above statement was accurate.
